1900

- William McKinley Re-elected as President
President McKinley defeats Jennings Bryan

- Foraker Act

The U.S. Congress passes the Foraker Act, establishing a civilian government in Puerto Rico under U.S. control. The Foraker Act provided for an elected House of Representatives on the island, but not for a vote in Washington. In 1898, Spain had ceded Puerto Rico to the U.S. with the Treaty of Paris, ending the Spanish-American War.

1901

- McKinley Assassinated

After his second inauguration in March of 1901, McKinley embarked on a tour of western states, where he was greeted by cheering crowds. The tour ended in Buffalo, New York, where he gave a speech on September fifth in front of 50,000 people at the Pan-American Exposition.

The following day, McKinley was standing in a receiving line at the exposition when an unemployed Detroit mill worker named Leon Czolgosz shot him twice in the chest at point-blank range. (Czolgosz, an anarchist, later admitted to the shooting and claimed to have killed the President because he was the "enemy of the people." He was executed in October 1901.) McKinley was rushed to a Buffalo hospital and initially received a hopeful prognosis, but gangrene set in around his wounds and he died eight days later, Vice President Theodore Roosevelt succeeds him.

- Theodore Roosevelt Becomes the 26th President

His foreign policy was "Speak softly and carry a big stick."

- Tallulah Bankhead is Born

- Lionel Electric Train Invented

Joshua Lionel Cowen, an inventive guy, had always been interested in trains. He fitted a small motor under a model of a railroad flatcar, powered by a battery on 30 inches of track and the Lionel electric train was born. The first Lionel train was designed to attract window-shopping New Yorkers using the power of animated display. Since its humble beginning Lionel has sold more than 50 million train sets and today produces more

than 300 miles of track yearly.

- Alabama's Archival Agency Created

Trustees of Alabama Department of Archives and History organize the nation's first state archival agency.

- New Alabama Constitution Ratified

1902

- First Rose Bowl Game

On January 1st the University of Michigan and Stanford University play in the first Rose Bowl

- First Open Heart Surgery Report

The New York Medical Record publishes an account of Dr. Luther Leonidas Hill, a physician in Montgomery, Alabama performing the first open heart surgery in the western hemisphere when he sutured a knife wound in a young boy's heart. Dr. Hill was the father of Alabama politician and U.S. Senator Lister Hill.

- The Teddy Bear for Children is Born

In November of 1902 President Theodore Roosevelt, often called Teddy Roosevelt, was on a hunting trip in Mississippi while trying to settle a boundary dispute between Mississippi and Louisiana. Being an accomplished outdoorsman, he liked to bag big game. However, his hunt was going poorly that day, and he couldn't find anything worthy of discharging his rifle. His staff, trying to accommodate him, captured a Louisiana black bear cub for the President to shoot, but he could not shoot him. The thought of shooting a bear tied to a tree did not seem sporting, so he spared the life of the bear and set it free.
